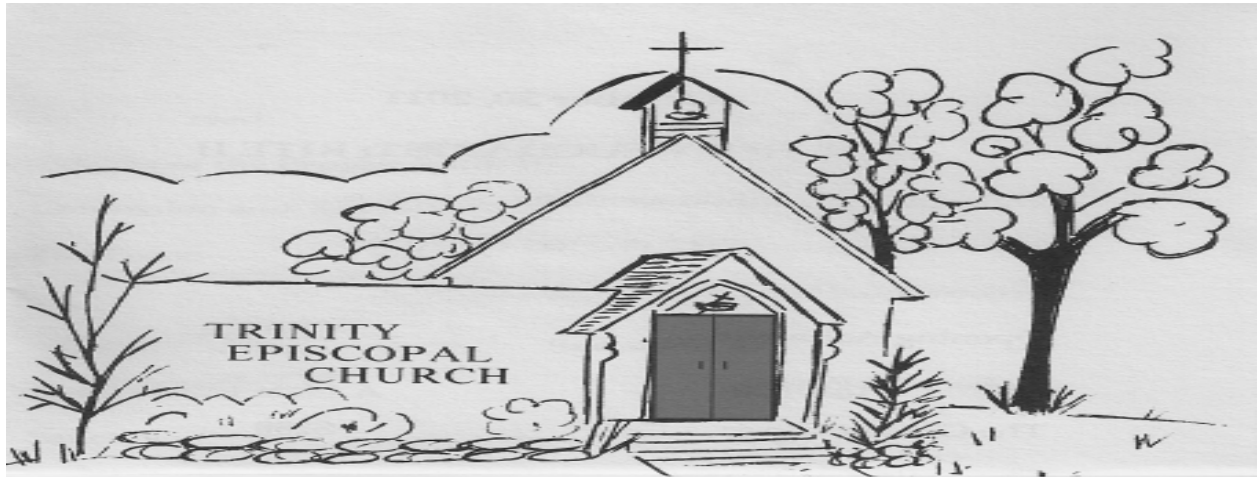

From Behind the Altar

As was the case last year, starting in June, the every-other-week Sunday School and the every-Sunday lectionary class will not meet. Those classes will resume on Sunday, September 11.

The weekly Wednesday luncheon and Bible study will continue to meet over the summer months. Starting on June 1, the class will study the Epistle to the Colossians.

The weekly celebrations of the Eucharist at 10:00 a.m. on Sundays, 5:30 p.m. on Wednesdays, and 10:30 a.m. on Thursdays will continue as usual.

Coming soon to Trinity will be our Bishop, Martin Field. His new custom is to visit congregations every other year on a day

other than Sunday. This is the year for his mid-week visit. He will be with us on Wednesday, June 22. Bishop Field will meet with the Bishop's Committee and me at 4:00 p.m. At 5:30 p.m. the Bishop will preside at the Holy Eucharist. Following the liturgy, the congregation will share in a potluck supper and visit with the Bishop. Karen Miller, the Bishop's Warden, will post a sign-up sheet for the meal on the parish hall bulletin board. Mark your calendars now.

Soon Trinity will get a new, much stronger and secure door for the parish hall. Several weeks ago someone tried to open the door using a fairly large knife. The Bishop's Committee decided that a new door was in order anyway. The current door is very old and the paneling on the bottom is cracked.

The new metal door will be installed before long. With its installation, will come the necessity of issuing new keys. The Junior Warden, Andrew Stake, will distribute the keys once the new door is in place.

Palace of Gold

This large Hindu-inspired palace was opened in 1979 with marble floors, crystal chandeliers, stained-glass windows, wood-carved furniture and walls covered in leaves of 22-karat gold. The building is surrounded by an splendid rose garden, fountain, thousands of different bushes plus a lotus-filled lake. West Virginia devotees of the International Society for Krishna

Consciousness (Hare Krishna) decided to build a home for their leader, Srila



Prabhupada. When Prabhupada died in 1977, the group changed construction plans from a simple home to a memorial for Prabhupada in Moundsville, West Virginia.

April through August, The Palace of Gold is open from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. daily. Tours are available through the year. Open from 10 am to 8 pm, the fee is \$8 for adults and \$6 for children ages 6 to 18 from April through August dropping to . From September to March, open hours change to 10 a.m. to 5 p.m with tour fees dropping to \$6 per adult and \$3 per child.
