

Note from Father Miller regarding Trinity's Holy Week Schedule

Holy Week/Easter is a busy time for God's Church. The celebration of the most sacred events in the life of our Lord commands our energy and commitment. I call your attention to the Holy Week/Easter schedule that follows:

The Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday (March 29): This liturgy has two distinct themes: the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem and his suffering and death. The liturgy begins at **10:00 a.m.**

Maundy Thursday (April 2): The night before Jesus died, he shared his last meal with his apostles, and in doing so transformed the meaning of a Jewish sacred meal into the central act of worship for Christians. While at table with his apostles, Jesus also washed their feet and thus demonstrated how they should relate to one another and the rest of the world. The liturgy begins at **7:00 p.m.**

Good Friday (April 3): No day is quite like this day. The Lord of life dies in order to give life. The faithful fast and feel sorrow and grief. If there is a day to feel sad, this is the day. The liturgy begins in silence and ends in silence. The congregation hears the Passion of Jesus again—this time according to John—and prays for all of the things for which Jesus gave his life. The liturgical assembly venerates the Cross, through which humankind's salvation was wrought, and the liturgy comes quickly to an end with the reception of Holy Communion from the Eucharist celebrated the night before. The Good Friday liturgy is at **7:00 p.m.**
